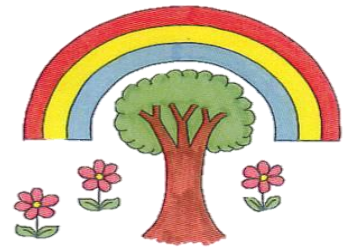




# SEND FAQ



Gainsborough Primary and Nursery School

I am worried about my child, who should I speak to?

Your child's class teacher is always the best place to start.

They will be able to talk through your concerns and if necessary refer to the SEND team in school.

What does SEND stand for?

SEND is a common abbreviation for the term: Special Educational Needs and/or Disability.

How do I contact the SEND team in school? I'd like to speak to the SENCO.

Once you have spoken with your child's class teacher, they can make you an appointment to speak with the SENCO if required.

If you would like to make an appointment with a member of the SENCO team yourself please speak to the school office who will make arrangements. Alternatively you may email [admin@gainsborough.cheshire.sch.uk](mailto:admin@gainsborough.cheshire.sch.uk).

SENCO drop in sessions are held every Wednesday morning in the Community Room, 8:45 – 9:15.

How will I know how my child is doing?

The school holds three times yearly Parent's Evenings, an opportunity to discuss your child's progress. A written school report is also sent out in the Spring Term.

How will Gainsborough know if my child needs help?

When quality first teaching strategies are in place and reasonable adjustments have been made to include all children, but progress continues to be below expected levels.

When speech and language therapist or other outside agencies are providing support care plans.
