Toucan birds of the Amazon are as big as an elephant's trunk off the ground.



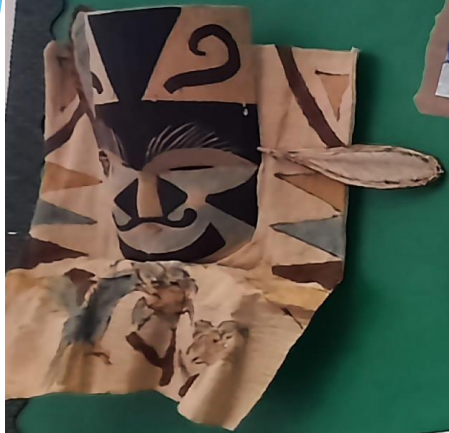
Have you ever been to a rainforest?
If not, you've probably heard of rainforests. Sometimes people call them "jungles".



50 percent of the animals on Earth live in the rainforests.



A black howler monkey can be heard almost 100 miles away.



Rainforests can be found in South America, Africa, Asia, and Latin America.

The Amazon Rainforest is the largest tropical rainforest in the world.

Why are they called rainforests?
Rainforests get from six feet to more than thirty feet of rain a year. It rains most days, often very hard. Inches of rain can fall in just a few hours. The plants in rainforests soak up much of the water that falls but some water is carried away by rivers.

Rainforests get an average of four to six inches of rain a year. Some get as much as 450 inches.
