Following on from the successful visit of the knife Angel sculpture last year, the Anti-Violence Bee represents Crewe's continued zero tolerance towards violence and aggression of any kind.

It is FREE to visit and is displayed on memorial square in Crewe. The giant monument has been made by British Ironworks from thousands of weapons, including knives and guns that have been collected from the streets of Manchester as part of a police amnesty.

On 22nd May our Year 5 and 6 pupils will be walking to Crewe to visit the Bee and to hear a talk from our local PCSO about anti-violence.

The monument is truly impressive, so why not pay it a visit yourself before it moves on to another town at the end of May.
